 We advocate for issues that we have studied (i.e., expanded library services, Vision 2040). We observe and give testimony at numerous government meetings such as Las Cruces City Council, Doña Ana County Commission, and Las Cruces Public Schools.
 We collaborate with a number of community organizations to bring about change that is the result of government action.

Because of space restrictions, candidates are limited to a specific number of words. Also, lists are converted to paragraphs and responses are converted to normal text. Candidates for each position are listed in alphabetical order within their party. Three dots at the end of a candidate's response indicate the word limit has been reached.
